There's a problem with this, however. Wherever you are mentally and spiritually when people notice and celebrate you, that's the place you'll likely anchor yourself in. That's

because you've chosen a label and the crowd has accepted and celebrated you with that label, causing you to finally accept yourself. Nevertheless, you wouldn't be accepting who you are in Christ; you'd be accepting who people want you to be. A good example is a woman who discovers that one of her talents is painting. Now, in Christ, she may be a powerful and talented prophetess whose paintings are nothing more than avenues God has opened for her to share His messages through. The woman is lost and has not truly found her way back to God, but her God-given talents are still very much present in her, so she begins to paint pictures of events to come. Her paintings are powerful, detailed and full of hidden messages that reveal themselves to those who have eyes to see them. People start to take notice of her work, and before long, she's revered as a gifted painter.
